AN INSPECTOR CALLS

Following the 1870 Education Act which introduced compulsory education for 5-13 year olds the Bingley School Board was formed and had offices in the upper floor of the Mornington Road Board School. Eldwick's Board School opened in 1877 on March 26th after the Bingley Board's own census of 1875 had recorded 129 Eldwick children between the ages of 3 and 13. Built to accommodate 150 children in just two rooms (!), the cost was £1099. The school's log book of the period shows that one Mary Ann Stubbs admitted just 51 children, many part-time, in three classes.

Children over ten years old attended schools for only two hours a day after passing Standard IV, or not at all after Standard V when they would be in employment. Achievement of standards was a critical factor in how a school was funded since grants were awarded when an inspector had visited the school and given a report. Obviously the Standards for 'the three R's were of paramount importance. In Reading for Standard I a short passage, not just one syllable had to be read. For Standard V reading was required from either a standard author or from the History of England.

In Writing the earliest Standard I was to copy in manuscript style a line with a capital letter. Progressing through, reading six lines from a reading book, to "writing from memory the substance of a short story and reading it out twice for Standard V. In Arithmetic lists, a knowledge of up to 6x tables was for Standard I. Notation and the four simple rules at Standard V involved ability to practise bills of parcels, addition and subtraction of fractions. Children moved up from class to class only if they had made the Standard required.

In January 1879 the Eldwick school logbook gives the figures from within the inspector's report. Average attendance by the 56 children @ 6 shillings per child yielded £16/6/0. That for 9 infants @ 10 shillings each brought £4/10/0. One hundred passes in exams @ 3 shillings realised £15. As an assistant master the salary was £60 per annum and the head master would receive £250, often plus the School House. The only good thing about a positive report by the inspector, as far as some were concerned, was that all children and staff were given an afternoon off as a reward, for their achievements in the year. The schools knew when the inspector was to call so a remarkable story emerged involving Mary Stubbs the head mistress of Eldwick School in 1879, only two years after the school had opened.

Mary was from Farnworth in Lancashire and was married to Caleb Stubbs who was from Kidsgrove in Staffordshire. He had

worked in the Potteries as an engineman so may have come to Eldwick to work at the Heights Lane Bingley Brick & Tile Company. In Eldwick he was a Sunday school teacher and Methodist Lay Preacher.

On April 23rd in 1879 it was reported that 'A Novel Case Affecting A School Mistress was held in Keighley County Court.' Before Mr D.K. Daniel the judge, was William Morley Preston, a mason of Brick Kiln Cottages in Eldwick, and Mary Ann Stubbs, a mistress under the Bingley School Board. William was to sue Mary for 16 shillings damages, alleged to have been occasioned by her refusal to allow his son Benjamin Washington Lincoln Preston, aged 10, to attend school. Mr. A. Neill, solicitor, appeared for the defendant. Plaintiff stated the defendant was the headmistress of Eldwick Board School. She prevented his son attending school on 2nd December 1879 and again on the 4th December when His Majesty's Inspector was in attendance to examine the children. His son was thus debarred from passing the exam, entitling him to a labour certificate and he lost the amount of wages which the lad must have earned otherwise. For this loss he claimed. His Honour reminded the plaintiff that his son was not his property and he was not in Zululand. How did he know his son would have passed the exam? Mr Neill, in defence, said that, previous to the last examination, his client had kept the children under her care, including the plaintiff's boy, a little later than the normal school hours, in order that they may pass a more creditable exam. The plaintiff on one occasion went into the school half an hour after the regular closing time and, in a very wild manner, ordered his son to go out of the school. As his action affected the question of discipline in the school, the mistress thought it would be her duty not to receive his child until he made an apology. This he refused to do. The matter had been before the Education Department and the School Board who just defended her action. His Honour said, in answer by some remarks by the plaintiff, said he was sitting in a court which was regulated by law and not by caprice and he could not see any grounds of right to sue on the part of the plaintiff or of liability on the part of the defendant. A non-suit was entered, with costs.

Mary and Caleb were listed as living in the School House, Otley Road in the 1881 census but then the story ends sadly. On 5th September of that year the school log reports the head mistress was absent through illness. Mary died nine days later, aged only 31.
